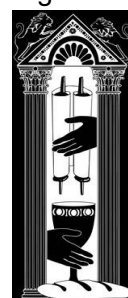
Today is the third, and last, in a run of Sunday feasts that draw us into the mysteries of God's relationship with us. Pentecost celebrates the God dwelling within each of us, Trinity Sunday celebrates the communal, relational God and finally today we celebrate the gift of God in the Eucharist, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This series of feasts are a yearly reminder - God wants to be part of our lives and for us to be part of God's life.

The **First Reading** is taken from text that features Moses reminding Israel of all God has done for them during the 40 years in the desert. In today's passage, bereft of all natural source of food and water, is the reminder that the Israelites had to rely upon God's provision of these essentials: water from the rock and the manna sent down from heaven. They had come to know the Lord as the Giver of all that is necessary for protection and life and needed to remember this in the Promised Land. The manna was indeed the 'Bread of Life'.

This experience is one of two that lie behind the images used in today's **Gospel**. The second is the experience of Eucharist in the early Christian communities. Remember that this Gospel was written long after Jesus' death and Christians have been gathering for Eucharist for about sixty years. Within Judaism, the story of the Manna in the wilderness was spiritualised so that later generations could still think of themselves as the recipients of this gift. Eating the bread of Wisdom was a metaphorical way of speaking about living according to the Law (Sirach 24:19-23, Proverbs 9:1-6).

John's Gospel continues this Jewish tradition of 'spiritualising' the manna, but takes it much further. Now, it is not the Law that provides the path to Wisdom, or can provide nourishment, but Jesus. Where the nourishment offered by Wisdom was such that people hungered for more, the nourishment Jesus offers is eternal since belief in Jesus draws the believer into Jesus' own life. The Gospel makes no attempt to explain *how* this happens, even though the Jews want to know. The Gospel simply affirms *that* it happens, that this is what John's community experience. When Christians gather together in prayer and thanksgiving Jesus is present. Each Eucharist is a recommitment, a restatement of our faith that Jesus is our way of life.

At the Passover meal, the third of the four cups taken is called 'the cup of blessing'. Paul asserts the significance of the cup of wine is not in its material substance but in its incorporation of the partakers in the blood of Christ and points out that sharing in the Eucharistic bread and cup, creates for believers 'communion' in two 'directions', so to speak: 'horizontally' with each other; 'vertically' with Christ.

Participation in Liturgy: Regularly attend Saturday or Sunday Mass in the Parish to help your child become familiar with the liturgy of the Mass and participate as much as possible.

Invitation: As Fr Pat gets to know you and your child he will invite you into the formal program.

Enrol / Prepare / Celebrate: Children are formally enrolled in the Sacramental Program and attend family centred activity sessions to prepare for the celebration of Penance, Confirmation and First Communion.
