
GOSPEL

Reflection ...

Last week's readings reminded us that God calls and sends us to the world. This week, they remind us that this sending will more than likely be uncomfortable and God's kingdom may be unwelcome. And in the midst of it all, we are reminded that God is with us, "do not be afraid".

The **First Reading's** passage has Jeremiah reflecting at length upon the difficulty of his vocation and, above all, of the message of woe he has to deliver to his fellow citizens. Though this brings down upon himself hostility from every side, he remains confident that the Lord, to whom he has 'committed his cause', will vindicate him in the end.



Jesus picks up this sense of God's presence with the prophets, in the **Gospel**, as he tells the disciples that God is with them as they proclaim what he has taught them. Remember this life is temporary, God wants to be with us for eternity. For the early Church, facing persecution and martyrdom, this would have been challenging but a comforting reassurance that God was with them in their experience. For a modern Church, do we trust God is with us in the social ambivalence, in the pressures on our time, on the absence of community support? Do we trust God to live our faith "from the rooftops"?

During Ordinary Time, the First Reading and the Gospel are thematically linked. The Second Reading works semi-continuously through one of the New Testament letters—at the moment the Letter to the Romans. This means that sometimes the Second Reading links well to the theme of the First Reading and the Gospel, sometimes it doesn't.

In this week's **Second Reading**, Paul proclaims the incomparable nature of God's saving grace by contrasting the actions of Adam and Christ. This is a significant focus of the first part of Romans. How can we truly respond to God call if we don't really understand the extent of the gift of grace we are offered?

Enrol / Prepare / Celebrate: Children are formally enrolled in the Sacramental Program and attend family centred activity sessions to prepare for the celebration of Penance, Confirmation and First Communion.
