## The Most Holy TRINITY, YEAR A

3 / 4 June 2023

### READINGS

**Exodus 34:4-6, 8-9** *The Lord God, ruler of all, merciful and loving.*

**2 Corinthians 13:11-13** *The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the  
love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit  
be with you all.*

### GOSPEL

**John 3:16-18** *God sent his Son to save the world through him.*

Too often the language of 'trinity' begins to sound mathematical: three in one, one in three. Trinity is a way of trying to put words on an unfathomable mystery of the inner life of God: a life we could never have imagined, except it was first experienced. The doctrine of the Trinity is not, then, an arid theological puzzle but a necessary conclusion from a sense of being grasped by and held within a divine communion of love.



This participation in divine communion comes through in the **First Reading**. God descends to meet the ascending Moses and then Moses is described as standing "with him [the Lord] there." Moses is in relationship with God, both as himself but also as representative of the people of Israel. Before he gets around to pleading with God for forgiveness and forbearance in regard to his 'headstrong' people, he hears from the Godhead itself a proclamation of the divine nature: 'The Lord, the Lord, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness'. Texts such as this show the absolute continuity between the God revealed in the Old Testament and the God revealed by Jesus Christ.

The **Second Reading** consists of the concluding grace from Paul's letter, prefaced by an exhortation to unity and peace in the community. The sense is that the community should reflect in *its* communal life and interaction the sense of communal love that it experiences from God. It is an early Christian text containing so complete a formulation of belief in the Trinitarian 'shape' of the Godhead.

The very nature of God is to love – to reach out to another in relationship. In this **Gospel's** conversation with Nicodemus Jesus describes why he has come into the world (Greek: *kosmos*); for love of this extraordinary cosmos God gave us a most precious gift in Jesus. John's Gospel makes the promise that those who receive this gift in faith will become children of God. This means of course that you and I are invited to be drawn into the very heart of God, to be drawn into the Trinity as part of God's own household. We are born into the family of God, able to call God 'Father' and each other sisters and brothers. In the first reading, this is what Moses begs for when he asks, 'adopt us as your heritage'.



The mystery of the Trinity means that in whatever way we portray God as Father, Son and Spirit it will always be inadequate and incomplete. All the images and words we use for the Trinity are more a reflection of our faith than the final word about God. God is always more than any name we use or any concept we have. The special insight into God we celebrate today is that relationships are at the very centre of who God is.
