READINGS

Isaiah 55:10-11

The rain makes the earth fruitful.

Romans 8:18-23

All creation is waiting for the revelation of the children of God.

GOSPEL

Matthew 13:1-23

A sower went out to sow.

The parables in today's readings from Isaiah and Matthew provide a mirror held up to us, to see in them the reflection of our own response to God's word.

Today's **First Reading** effectively forms the conclusion of the second part of Isaiah (40–55). These chapters, or this second 'book', proclaims God's compassion for those exiled in Babylon; their suffering and alienation from their land is about to end. The prophecy makes what for many contemporaries would have been an outrageous, even laughable, claim. God will use the Persian ruler, Cyrus, to deliver the peoples of tiny, insignificant Israel and Judah. And even more, Israel and Judah (small as they are) will be entrusted with God's mission "to the ends of the earth." One can imagine that such massive claims would have generated vigorous debate among exiles and others. This concluding statement effectively reminds the audience—what God says, God does.



In the **Gospel**, the sower is over-abundant with the way he throws the seed haphazardly, not worrying about where the seed lands or how much of the seed will be "harvestable". God's love and call is the same—it "falls" on us all. The hearer must decide for themselves do they hear God's word at a surface level and not allow it to take root (like the rock), do they push it aside (eaten by birds), do they allow life to overwhelm it (weeds), or do they allow it to take root and grow—changing their lives in the process.

The **Second Reading** is as an expression of hope: hope not just for the eventual salvation of human beings but a hope that the non-human created world, with its necessary connection to our own bodily existence, might somehow share in that salvation as well. This is in fact one of the few passages in the New Testament where the fate of the world – what Pope Francis calls 'Our Common Home' in his encyclical *Laudato Sí* – seems also to be in view.
