### 17th SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME, YEAR A 29 / 30 July 2023

#### READINGS

1 Kings 3:5, 7-12

*You have asked for wisdom.*

Romans 8:28-30

*He predestined us to become true images of his Son.*

#### GOSPEL

Matthew 13:44-52

*He sells everything he owns and buys the field.*

Ancient authors did not record history objectively (as we like to think we do) but composed a particular version to convey a particular meaning or interpretation of reality. Today's **First Reading** comes soon after Solomon has, in the narrative, established himself as David's successor. He does the right thing and seeks guidance from God, going to Gibeon which was the principal place of worship before the temple in Jerusalem is built. Rather than seek personal advantage he seeks to serve his people, requesting 'a heart to understand how to discern between good and evil'. As a reward for his humility and self-denial, God promises that Solomon will be wiser than any before him. Solomon has chosen the "better part".

The first two parables in today's **Gospel** are essentially Jesus trying to find ways of explaining why the reign of God, "the better part", has so captivated his own imagination. Of course Jesus speaks of a treasure and a pearl he has already found, while the disciples and later Christians only glimpse God's reign in moments of insight. The parables are not about what one 'ought' to do; they simply describe what happens in the life of people who have caught a glimpse of the kingdom. While not yet within their grasp, it is already bringing joy, freedom and hope to human lives. The Kingdom's description here mirrors the descriptions of Wisdom in the Hebrew Scriptures where wisdom is the gift of God and more valuable than jewels, silver or gold, achieved at whatever cost and not to be forsaken.

The third parable that Matthew offers picks up the theme of last week's parable about the weeds and the wheat growing together. It shifts the image from gardening to fishing where the net hauls in a wide catch of both good fish and worthless things. Once again, there will come a time when sorting will happen but not in the middle of the fishing process. Only when the fishing work is over, will the catch be sorted. We can wonder at what must have been happening in Matthew's community for him to give his community these two parables, as they are not recorded in Mark and Luke. Were divisions starting to happen? Were people beginning to make judgments about others, perhaps wanting to sort out the community? Could Matthew be trying to teach his local church to leave the sorting out to God? The fact that these are only in Matthew certainly suggests that these had some particular purpose, even if today we can only guess what that might be.

The **Second Reading**, continues Paul's case for hope deriving from his belief that we (believers) are all caught up within an unfolding divine plan that is already well under way. The goal of this plan is that human beings become images of the risen Christ, who is himself the image of God. This will occur when believers fully share his risen life through their own resurrection. At that time, Christ will not only be the unique Son of God, but the 'eldest' of many brothers (and sisters) within the one family of God.


