Sept 1 - October 4 is celebrated as the Season of Creation, which we remember liturgically in our prayers and in our hymns. This year's theme is "Let Justice and Peace Flow", and is a call, with Christians worldwide, to join the river of justice and peace (Amos 5:24), to take up climate and ecological justice, and to speak out with and for those most impacted. Also keep an eye on our Parish Facebook page over the month as we offer prayer and other opportunities to help celebrate this Season.

Today's **First Reading** starts with a key claim about vocation: it is God's initiative, a manifestation of the power of God. And it continues recounting the cost of living this vocation. This poem or prayer of lament is one of many examples (especially in the Psalms) of people taking their problems to God, even when they disagree with what God might be doing. Our relationship with God isn't only for the good times.

Last week, Peter gives voice to the growing recognition that Jesus is the Messiah. In today's **Gospel**, Peter once again speaks out. Peter can't accept the mission (and it's ending) Jesus sees. Surely this can't be what Israel was waiting for. Peter was looking for a warrior, someone to regain Israel's political freedom. Jesus was hearing a call to the world's freedom. Peter's statement echoes the temptations in the desert—take the easier road, surely God can't ask this of you. But Jesus pushes back against the temptation, even from his friend. God's way, even when it means putting self last, is the call of discipleship and Jesus challenges whether his followers are willing to pay the cost. Are they willing to let go of the things held dearest and to put God and others before themselves, to recognise God as Creator and self as creature? It's both a challenging and a freeing realisation.

The **Second Reading**, echoes Jesus saying the cost of discipleship being our whole selves. For Paul, our 'bodies' refers not simply to our physical bodies but to our whole pattern of life, everything we do or say. To 'offer (our) bodies' in this sense as a 'living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God' entails a similar preparedness to discern and follow the way of God.

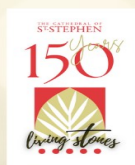

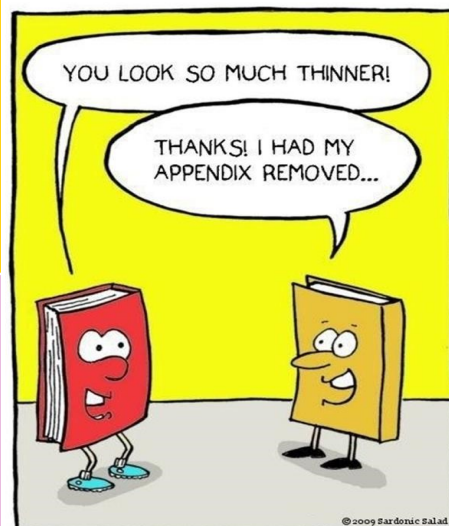
