Sept 1—October 4 is celebrated as the Season of Creation, which we remember liturgically in our prayers and in our hymns. This year's theme is "Let Justice and Peace Flow". If you'd like to know more about the Season of Creation have a look at <https://seasonofcreation.org/>. Also keep an eye on our Parish

Facebook page over the month as we offer prayer and other opportunities to help celebrate this Season.

What today's readings have in common is the theme of personal responsibility. While salvation is from beginning to end the product of divine grace, we are free to say 'Yes' and 'No' to God's invitation.

In the **First Reading**, Ezekiel is in debate with opponents about a traditional proverbial saying or jibe that is quoted at the beginning of the chapter: *'the fathers have eaten sour grapes and the children's teeth are set on edge'*. The people are using this to abdicate responsibility for their current situation in two ways. Firstly, God has dealt unjustly with the people because of their ancestors and, secondly, their current suffering is the fault of their ancestors. Notice there is no personal responsibility here. Of course, life isn't straight forward. We know bad things happen to good people. In this passage Ezekiel is calling the people to own their choices and seek God's ways above all else.

In the **Second Reading**, Paul uses an early hymn to paint the picture of Christ's choices. Christ's choices are proposed as the model for the behaviour of the early Christian community (and us), so much so that we should "in [our] minds be the same as Christ Jesus", putting the good of others before ourselves, all to the glory of God.

In the **Gospel**, the sons have two choices. The first is their response to their father, the second is the action they take. The parable powerfully makes the point that what God looks to – and can wait with infinite patience for – is the final outcome in people's lives. God can put up with an initial 'No', and a lot of other 'No's' besides, on the way to a final and lasting 'Yes'. On the other hand, a "Yes" can be simply superficial and never reach the deep conversion of heart that gives the capacity to say 'Yes' with an abundance of freedom that overflows into a pattern of life truly reflective of God's grace.



What will ultimately determine fitness for eternal life is conformity of the human heart to the heart of God. None of us could ever amass sufficient good works to merit even a second of life with God. This life will be God's gift in abundance if only we have grown – sometimes in the course of a very winding and to-and-fro life journey – into the capacity to receive it. But if our faith does not lead us to action then we find ourselves in the position of the second son, who sounds good but his words are hollow.
