Sept 1—October 4 is celebrated as the Season of Creation, which we remember liturgically in our prayers and in our hymns. This year's theme is "Let Justice and Peace Flow". If you'd like to know more about the Season of Creation have a look at <https://seasonofcreation.org/>. Also keep an eye on our Parish Facebook page over the month as we offer prayer and other

opportunities to help celebrate this Season.

Today the Catholic Church in Australia also marks Safe-guarding Sunday (formerly Child Protection Sunday) at the conclusion of National Child Protection Week. Safe-guarding Sunday seeks to acknowledge the immense damage caused by the sexual abuse of children and adults at risk, including by priests, religious and lay people within Catholic contexts. It makes a commitment to practices and protocols that create and maintain safe environments for all people. It invites people to pray for those harmed by abuse directly and indirectly.

It is somewhat fitting then that a theme of the responsibility members of a community have for the moral wellbeing of others. The readings gives some guidance for what would subsequently be called 'fraternal correction' – something clearly requiring much sensitivity and something that we are, perhaps, rediscovering in our Church at this time.

In the **First Reading** the prophet is called to keep watch over the entire house of Israel. God will hold him responsible if he does not protect the people by proclaiming the word to them. If he is faithful to his charge, he can rest assured that he has fulfilled his responsibility even if the people refuse to heed his message.

The **Gospel** starts with guidelines for how the growing early Church could "keep watch" over each other, first with a personal intervention (one-to-one), then with a couple of others, and finally the whole community. Notice the goal of each step is reconciliation. But if the matter cannot be resolved, then the concern needs to be for the unity and harmony of the community. Paul takes a similar stance in his advice to the community at Corinth (1Cor 5:1-13).

In the Jewish tradition it required the presence of ten men before a synagogue prayer group could form. Jesus changes this requirement and promises that a group of two is sufficient for his presence. There is something very intimate about Jesus' promise to be present.



The **Second Reading**, provides a fitting complement to this instruction on community living. The redemption from sin and death which God's love has won for us in Christ has created an inexhaustible 'debt' of love. We will never be able to discharge that debt of love owed to God. God wants us to consider it owed to our fellow human beings, deserving or undeserving as they may be. Paul is showing, directly drawing on Jesus' teaching, that the Law is fulfilled completely in the act of loving others without exception.
