READINGS

Exodus 22:20-26 *If you are harsh with the widow or the orphan, my
anger will rage against you.*

1 Thessalonians 1:5-10 *You turned away from idols to serve God and await
his Son.*

GOSPEL

Matthew 22:34-40 *You shall love the Lord your God and your
neighbour as yourself.*

The theme in today's readings, the unity between the love of God and love of neighbour, goes to the very heart of the Christian tradition. It seems that the two commandments, existing separately in the Old Testament (see Deut 6:4-5 and Lev 19:18), were brought together by Jesus. But in uniting them he drew upon the tradition of his people where all the commandments were enclosed within the overall covenant commitment to God.

Today's **First Reading** comes from what commentators call 'the Covenant Code', a commentary/interpretation/application of the brief commands in the Decalogue or Ten Commandments (Exod 20:1-17) as part of the covenant made at Mt Sinai. Today's reading can be understood as commentary on the command 'thou shalt not steal', expanding it to cover taking unfair advantage over others, especially those who are at a disadvantage. However, we should not compartmentalise the ten commandments; they are interrelated and this commentary may also include bearing false witness against another and coveting another's goods. We also see what we now call God's "preferential option" for the poor. The foreigner, the widow and the orphan were the most visibly vulnerable, and a regular refrain through the Hebrew Scriptures identifies this trio for particular care by the people of Israel. A modernisation might include the refugee, the elderly, the unemployed, the sick, the homeless... The Scriptures call us to care for those who are vulnerable.

Before reading today's **Gospel**, it is helpful to place this passage in its Gospel context. In last Sunday's Gospel we read about the Herodians and Pharisees trying to trap Jesus with a trick question about taxes. Then follows a further trick question, this time asked by the Sadducees about the resurrection, since they do not believe in resurrection. Then today's Gospel picks up with a return to the Pharisees.

The question the Pharisees put to Jesus lies at the very heart of the Torah – the Law. Jesus' response is the great prayer of Israel, the Shema. *'This then is the commandment... that the Lord your God has commanded, "Hear Oh Israel! The Lord your God, the Lord is One. And you shall love the Lord your God with your whole heart, and with your whole being, and with your whole strength."'* Jesus ties to this the command from Leviticus, 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself'. Love of God and love of neighbour is the essence of the Law. And essentially an answer to last week's "give to God what is God's", 100% of who we are—our heart, soul, mind and strength. And while that might seem a big call, think of what God has first offered us—100% of God's self.

As important as teaching may be, today's **Second Reading** remind us that the gospel is principally handed down by the example of life. The lifestyle of Paul and his missionary companions converted the Thessalonians. It made such an extraordinary effect on their lives that they in turn made a comparable impact on the lives of others. Each of us are commissioned in our Baptism, Confirmation and at the end of every Mass, to take the Good News to the world with our lives. How are you sharing God's Good News this week?
