READINGS

Wisdom 6:12-16

Wisdom is found by those who look for it.

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

*Those who died as Christians, God will bring
to life with Jesus.*

GOSPEL

Matthew 25:1-13

*Look, the bridegroom comes. Go out to meet
him.*

In the **First Reading**, the author wants to encourage readers to seek wisdom but also to instruct them that the wisdom they seek is divine. It is a share in the wisdom of God. Note how the passage strikes a nice balance between human endeavour and divine initiative. The student is urged to seek wisdom but the one who finds her will discover in fact that she (wisdom) has actually found him or her. The text is also implying that God is so ready and willing to bestow the gift of wisdom that God will immediately come to the one who shows genuine interest. Israel's God is not a god of secret knowledge, concealing it from humanity; rather God is a mystery that is always unfolding its meaning (Wisdom is bright and never grows dim).

The parable in the **Gospel** draws on two familiar images for a first century audience. In the Old Testament, the reign of God is frequently likened to a wedding banquet with God as the bridegroom reaching out in love to Israel the bride.

On the day of the wedding, all those invited would gather and then the bride would process from her father's house to the house of her fiancé. A last minute delay could occur if there was some disagreement over the marriage contract and bridal gifts. In the parable some of the bridesmaids have come prepared for a long wait, while others were not ready.

After the Resurrection, there was at first an enthusiastic expectation that God's final reign was about to dawn. Some members of that first community no doubt expected to be alive for Jesus' final coming in glory. By the time of Matthew's Gospel fifty years have passed and still people are waiting. Some are prepared for this and they have made an effort to have the necessary resources, while others find the waiting too long and their resources dry up. The Gospel asks us to consider our own resources and how do we ensure that these do not run out. What resources my faith? Daily personal quiet time with God, joining with others for reflective reading and prayer, being part of a local worshipping community, the works described in other places in Matthew as the markers of the life of a believer (caring for the poor, the sick, the imprisoned), reading spiritual books, taking time for a retreat day occasionally, taking a short course on some aspect of faith, and most of all, having a close friend I can talk with, about where God is in my life. These are ways I find that nourish my faith, that provide the 'oil for my lamp'. And yes, this takes some effort – the daily discipline of making time, the yearly determination to set aside some days, keeping an eye out for good reading or good seminars being offered. But without these resources, I suspect like some of the bride's companions I could soon lose sight of my purpose.

The **Second Reading's** Thessalonians were an enthusiastic community who had received the Gospel with joy and anticipates that Jesus will be returning to them any day soon. But, as time passes some of the community die and this raises many questions for them. Paul argues that those joined to Christ share in his victory over death. He draws on elements from the apocalyptic tradition to describe the events that will take place at the end of time when all will be finally joined to Christ.

Both the Second Reading and the Gospel give us a sense of the strong expectation felt by these two early communities, twenty and fifty years after the Easter event. The challenge for us is have we lost that sense of urgency, longing, hope, and joyful preparation.


