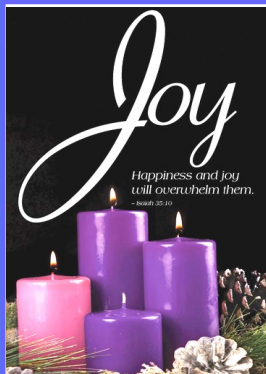

READINGS: Isaiah 61:1-2, 10-11; 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE

Priest: Lord, our God,

JESSE TREE SYMBOLS

Through the season of Advent, we will add two symbols a week to the Jesse Tree. They remind us of the faithfulness of God and of the men and women God used to prepare the world, down through Jewish history for the coming of Jesus.

The **Burning Bush** reminds us of God's call to Moses (Exodus 3-4:17). It reminds us that God works through people, often the unexpected, and often those who would see themselves as unqualified (Moses didn't speak well). It also reminds us of God's self-description as "I am who I am." God is ever present and active.



The **Tambourine** reminds us of the praise and worship of God. Miriam leads the Israelites with dancing and rejoicing (Exodus 15). Deborah and Barak sing God's praises (Judges 5). The Psalmist regularly reminds listeners to sing songs of praise with many musical instruments to God. David dances before the Lord (1 Chronicles 15-16).

This week's gospel is St John's particular slant of Mark story we heard last week. Along with greater focus on the conversational interaction, it presents John as a 'witness'. This is perhaps more typical of the John gospel emphasis on personal encounter with Jesus. Rather than acting as something of a herald, as in last week's account, here John the Baptist is witnessing 'to speak for the light'. He makes a very clear distinction between himself and the Christ, his mission is simply to point towards the light; the Christ.

Our common understanding of the word 'witness' tends to be related to legal situations: providing a witness statement or acting as a witness to a fact in court. The use of witness in this gospel carries a different connotation: to provide witness through action and lifestyle that draws others to wonder about and perhaps come to accept the motivating belief. It is this understanding of witness that all Christians are called to provide. We are called to witness to our beliefs in the way that we live our lives, engage with others and hold to certain truths. Whether we choose to witness through our words or through our actions it is essential that both words and actions have integrity; that there is no clash between what we proclaim and the way we live.

[Christian Initiation of Children of Catechetical Age]

Registrations are open for children aged 7 years or older who wish to receive the Sacraments in 2024. There are four steps:

- Step 1:** Contact the Parish Sacramental Registrar, Hazel, on 3849 7158 or sec.umg@bne.catholic.net.au and register your child who will receive a Mass card.
- Step 2:** Come along to Mass as often as possible to enable your child to learn the ropes, feel confident in the church, participate in the liturgy as he/she is ready and begins to feel at home.
- Step 3:** As Fr Pat gets to know you and your child he will invite you to take the next step.
- Step 4:** Children are enrolled in the Sacrament Program and will attend family centred activity sessions to prepare for the celebration of Penance, Confirmation and First Communion.

If children are not yet Baptised, please contact the parish office. Fr Pat or Pauline are happy to talk to you about the process and assist you.
