## FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, YEAR B

27 / 28 JANUARY 2024

### READINGS

**Deuteronomy 18:15-20** I will put my words into the prophet's mouth, and he will tell them all I command.

**1 Corinthians 7:32-35** The unmarried woman dedicates herself to the things of the Lord, that she might be holy.

### GOSPEL

**Mark 1:21-28**

This is a new kind of teaching that speaks with authority.

In the First Reading, Moses affirms the promise of God's continued presence with the people – not just in the Tabernacle/Tent of Meeting which would eventually become the Temple, but in the prophets God would send to guide the people. The prophets would be leaders like Moses, and the people were to listen and to follow them. The prophets are warned of the seriousness of this responsibility. If they lead people astray (said anything God has not directed), they would be dealt with directly by God. This passage would later take on a messianic overtone – the Messiah would be prophet like the great Moses. This parallel is particularly strong through Matthew's Gospel.

Mark's Gospel picks up the image of Jesus as "a prophet like Moses" in the authority of Jesus' teaching. The normal pattern of teaching in those days would have been to quote the teaching of a former great rabbi – 'According to Rabbi Hillel . . . ' or, 'As Rabbi Nathan said . . . '. But Jesus teaches from his own experience and knowledge of God. This gives his words an astounding authority – no wonder his reputation spread.



The authority of the teaching is then seen in action in the expulsion of the demon. This episode suggests that there is a very close link in Mark's view between the liberation involved in genuine teaching and the liberation involved in expelling demons. It enacted, albeit more physically, a liberation that was going on within all present as they listened to Jesus and drank in his words. 'Captivities' of prejudice, fears, scruples, guilts, ignorance about God, were dragged out of all present. Rather than being mere spectators of what is being described, the Gospel invites those who hear it to identify with Jesus' audience in the synagogue and to consider all the ways in which their own lives need to be set free through the power and teaching of Jesus.



The Second Reading continues Paul's long response to the questions from the Corinthian Church that prompted the letter to be written. Taken out of context, this reading can be misinterpreted as suggesting he is against marriage. This is not the case. Within Judaism marriage and children are a great blessing and it would be very odd for Paul to advise against marrying – except that he is anticipating the return of Jesus very soon. His main concern is 'that you give your undivided attention to the Lord'. And notice the closing words of this reading – Paul is giving an opinion based on what he understands at the time, not an injunction to be imposed on believers.

### [Christian Initiation of Children of Catechetical Age]

Registrations are open for children aged 7 years or older who wish to receive the Sacraments in 2024. There are four steps:

**Step 1:** Contact the Parish Office on **3849 7158** or **sec.umg@bne.catholic.net.au** and **register** your child who will receive a Mass card.

**Step 2:** Come along to Mass as often as possible to enable your child to learn the ropes, feel confident in the church, **participate in the liturgy** as he/she is ready and begins to feel at home.

**Step 3:** As Fr Pat gets to know you and your child he will **invite** you to take the next step. Please be aware we run two groups per year (Semester 1 and Semester 2).

**Step 4:** Children are **enrolled** in the Sacrament Program and will attend family centred activity sessions to **prepare** for the celebration of **Penance, Confirmation and First Communion**.
