The season of Lent is a holy time, time set apart to refocus on God. The Churches are bare, we sing less, we don't use parts of our normal liturgy (e.g. the Gloria). We strip everything back to essentials. We focus on truly seeking God, not primarily in outward sign or ritual, but in deep inner knowing.

Lent calls us to be on the lookout for God in our world. In our readings, Noah sees God at work in a flood, the Holy Spirit takes Jesus out into the desert and Paul points to our meeting with God in Baptism. God is present in unexpected ways and places, if only we have the willingness to try to see.


The penitential nature of the season focuses us on the call to transformation. The Good News, that is at the centre of Christ's mission, is that God will overcome all that is not right with the world. Evil will not win. So our Lenten observances are geared towards transforming us more and more into the image and likeness of Christ. We recognise the temptations of our lives and we seek to find ways to turn from them towards God.



It's important to remember in our own particular deserts that temptation is not sin. To be tempted by something is not the same as doing it. Temptations are the allures that make destructive choices look good.

And it's clear from all the Gospels that the desert and the temptations stayed with Jesus throughout his life. What a comfort this is to us.

This weekend the Church celebrates the next stage of the journey for those adults journeying towards Baptism at Easter. The Rite of Election, celebrated at the Cathedral, brings the catechumens before the gathered Church for the Church to accept them, based on the election by God, in whose name the Church acts. The catechumens become the Elect, and begin the final preparation, more intense, stage of preparation for the sacraments of initiation.
