READINGS

Acts 4:8-12

This is the only name by which we can be saved.

1 John 3:1-2

We shall see God as he is.

GOSPEL

John 10:11-18

The good shepherd lays down his life for his sheep.

Today's First Reading and Gospel are provoked by very similar events. Both are the response to criticism for compassion.

In the **First Reading**, Peter is responding to the Sanhedrin, the religious leaders of the Jews. Peter has healed a man in Jesus' name. Remember the Sanhedrin roughly two months ago called Jesus a blasphemer and pushed Pilate into executing him, so we can imagine how they must have felt seeing Peter do this. On top of that Peter and the other apostles are preaching and teaching and they are starting to draw a crowd. So, like Jesus before them, Peter and John are seized and brought before the Sanhedrin. Today's reading is Peter's speech in response to their questioning. Peter responds with courage and conviction, again drawing on the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament), in this case Psalms.

In the **Gospel**, Jesus is also responding to criticism for healing a blind man. This 'Good Shepherd' image reaches right back to the tradition that the first king of the royal house of Judah, David, was originally a young shepherd. Instead of lording it over their subjects like the rulers of other peoples, Israelite kings, as successors of David, were meant primarily to be shepherds for the people. Few kings lived up to this standard. But the long awaited Son of David, the Messiah, was expected to be the 'Good Shepherd (King)' *par excellence*.

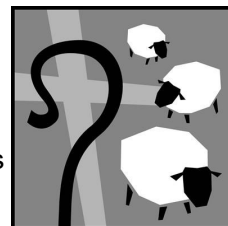
Jesus is criticising the Scribes and the Pharisees leadership, saying they are like the hired help who don't really know their flock, but that Jesus knows his flock and they know him. This is a two way relationship, not imposed authority, and that this relationship is based in service and sacrifice - the shepherd willing puts the flocks needs before his own, whatever the cost.

Throughout the Gospel, people have looked to Jesus as the long awaited Jewish Messiah, the one expected at the end of time to bring about the reign of God in peace and justice. Frequently they want a political Messiah like David, a warrior to liberate them from Rome. Jesus refuses to accept these messianic images. The one image he will accept is that of the messianic good shepherd, prepared to lay down his life.

In both Readings, Jesus and Peter are challenging others (particularly leaders) to see with God's perspective, to be compassionate, to seek the best for others. Do I live up to the challenge?

A main theme of 1John is the love that God has for believers. This love (*agápe*) is generative; it makes believers children of God, they are a new reality (they no longer belong to the world, the old reality) who are likely to be rejected just as Jesus was. And like children, we are growing into who we will ultimately become. It's an ongoing transformation in love.
