The period of Easter-Pentecost celebrates some of the most important events and beliefs in Christ tradition. They provide the basis of beliefs and teachings such as: Christ present in the Eucharist; the resurrection of Jesus and the hope of resurrection for all people; the divinity of Jesus; and the ongoing action of the Holy Spirit in the world.

This week the church celebrates another central doctrine of Christian faith: The Trinity. Belief in the Trinity is the belief that there are three 'persons' in the one Godhead: Father; Son; and Holy Spirit. The word 'Trinity' does not appear anywhere in the New Testament although one can certainly see the beginnings of ideas about a Trinitarian God. It was not until 325, at the Council of Nicea, that the doctrine of the trinity was established as being orthodox teaching.

Humanity is created in the image of God so our idea of God is important in understanding ourselves. If our idea of God is wrong then we can imagine ourselves in a way which is dangerously de-humanising.

If we think of God as solitary Being then we might imagine that the best way of being human is to be solitary, self-sufficient, totally in-dependent of others. However, Jesus Christ revealed a different way for the eyes of faith to see God.

Jesus speaks of God intimately as Father, as being One with the Father, and (in sending the Advocate/Holy Spirit) speaks of being with the disciples always. If this God-in-communion is our image of God, then our image of ourselves must be relational too. To be open to communion with God, other human beings and the whole of creation is to enjoy a Heavenly existence.

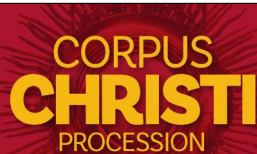
