FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR B

13 / 14 July 2024

READINGS

Amos 7:12-15

Go, prophesy to my people.

Ephesians 1:3-14

Before the world was made, he chose us in Christ.

GOSPEL

Mark 6:7-13

He called the Twelve, and began to send them out.

The **First Reading** tells the story of Amos' rejection by the priest at the shrine of Bethel. Amos preached at a time when the southern and northern Kingdoms of Israel (Judah and Israel, respectively) existed side by side. Amos was a southerner given the unenviable task of being sent as a prophet to the northern kingdom. Bethel ("house of God") was the main centre of workshop for the Northern Kingdom, set up so that northern Israel would not have to go to southern Judean Jerusalem. Worship at Bethel, while still faithful to the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, had become corrupted and (in particular) condoned/legitimised glaring social inequality.

Amos' rejection highlights the vulnerability of the prophet as they cannot prove they are on a mission from God. All they can do is proclaim their faith in their calling and speak the message they believe they have received. It's God's authority that lies behind the message, seen in its eventual vindication by events.

This granted authority could be the link to the **Gospel**, but so could the vulnerability. Jesus sends out the Twelve with his authority, and this authority is seen in their preaching forgiveness, casting out devils and healing the sick—or in other words, successfully continuing Jesus own early works. But they are left vulnerable to the hospitality of those who would receive them. They carry no extra clothes, food or money. They must rely on the provision of God.



But what if they are left vulnerable? What if someone rejects them? "Shake the dust off your feet", Jesus tells them. Leave that place behind you and move on. Don't carry doubts (about your ability) or anger (with the people who rejected you) forward, this mission is God's work, you are just the instrument.

In the **Second Reading**, we have moved to the letter to the Ephesians. Our reading opens with a benediction, a blessing from God that comes to us through Christ. Believers are not chosen *because* they are holy and blameless, but *that they might be made* holy and blameless. Salvation is the cause not the consequence of righteousness. Furthermore, believers are chosen for adoption into the family of God. This passage could possibly have been an early hymn of the Church, presenting Christ incarnation not as an interruption of creation but as part of a process or plan that God had in mind from the beginning.

PARISH SACRAMENTAL JOURNEY: CICCA

[Christian Initiation of Children of Catechetical Age]

Registrations are open for children aged 7 years or older who wish to receive the Sacraments in Round 2 2024. There are four steps:

Step 1: Contact the Parish Office on 3849 7158 or sec. umg@bne.catholic.net.au and register your child who will receive a Mass card.

Step 2: Come along to Mass as often as possible to enable your child to learn the ropes, feel confident in the church, participate in the liturgy as he/she is ready and begins to feel at home.

Step 3: As Fr Pat gets to know you and your child he will invite you to take the next step. Please be aware we run two groups per year (Semester 1 and Semester 2).

Step 4: Children are enrolled in the Sacrament Program and will attend family centred activity sessions to prepare for the celebration of Penance, Confirmation and First Communion.

If children are not yet Baptised, please contact the parish office. Fr Pat or Pauline are happy to talk to you about the process and assist you in any way.
