READINGS

2 Kings 4:42-44 *They will eat and have some left over.*

Ephesians 4:1-6 *There is one body, one Lord, one faith, on baptism.*

GOSPEL

John: 6:1-15 *He distributed to those who were seated as much
as they wanted.*

This weekend is the first of five where a series of Gospels taken from the sixth chapter of the Fourth Gospel interrupts the Year of Mark. The 'Bread of Life' (John 6) sequence as a whole displays a pattern that can be discerned in several of the long discourses in the Fourth Gospel. The remedying of a human need – usually through a miracle – functions as a symbol of a far more profound gift involving the person of Jesus himself. John's Gospel sets out to reassure his Jewish-Christian community that they have not lost the rich traditions of Judaism in following Jesus; on the contrary, the Gospel teaches that the great traditions of Judaism are brought to fulfilment and perfection in Christ.

The **First Reading** bears an uncanny resemblance to Jesus multiplying loaves (and fish) to feed a multitude, making a perfect set up for today's Gospel. The prophet is presented with loaves that are the first fruits of the farmer's harvest for the year. Elisha, seeing the need of the people in the midst of famine, puts them first and tells his servant to feed them. Like the disciples in the Gospels, the servant is challenged to believe that seemingly inadequate human resources will become more than adequate because he is effectively doing God's work. When the Lord supplies, the generosity is unstinting.

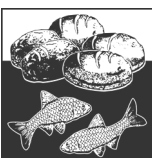
In the **Gospel** another seemingly inconsequential gift is miraculously used to meet the needs of the people. While the Gospels over the coming weeks will show this story in its Eucharistic light, for today, let us stay with the simple story being told. The apostles have been with Jesus for some time, they have witnessed miracles. But when Jesus asks about feeding the crowd, they are stumped.

A small boy (compared to the adult apostles) gives all he has, which Jesus takes and shares. And not only is there enough, there is more than enough to spare. God has taken the simplest offering and met the needs of the people with over abundance.

Do we trust God to do the same with us? To take our limited amounts of time, talents or money and use what we offer to improve the world the world around us. Or, are we reluctant to give what we have because "it will never be enough"?

The **Second Reading**, continues the theme of unity from last week. In spite of the differences in a community of Jews and Gentiles with different cultures and traditions, the community is encouraged to 'bear with one another in love' in harmony that is grounded in their belonging to the one body of Christ, their being filled with and fashioned by one Spirit of God, and their being moved by the one hope of their call to salvation.

[Christian Initiation of Children of Catechetical Age]

Registrations are open for children aged 7 years or older who wish to receive the Sacraments in Round 2 2024. There are four steps:

Step 1: Contact the Parish Office on **3849 7158** or email **sec.umg@bne.catholic.net.au** and **register** your child who will receive a Mass card.

Step 2: Come along to Mass as often as possible to enable your child to learn the ropes, feel confident in the church, **participate in the liturgy** as he/she is ready and begins to feel at home.

Step 3: As Fr Pat gets to know you and your child he will **invite** you to take the next step. Please be aware we run two groups per year (Semester 1 and Semester 2).

Step 4: Children are **enrolled** in the Sacrament Program and will attend family centred activity sessions to **prepare** for the celebration of **Penance, Confirmation and First Communion**.
