FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR B

6 / 7 July 2024

READINGS: Ezekiel 2:2-5 2 Corinthians 12:7-10

GOSPEL: Mark 6:1-6

This weekend marks the beginning of NAIDOC Week. In our communities, there are many activities planned and you can get information by joining the Archdiocesan Facebook RAP page <https://bit.ly/3XMffkH>. Abp. Mark invites all Catholics to imagine and enact a new kind of engagement with our indigenous peoples. He reminds us that it is not about politics/ideology but it's about the power of the gospel where we can walk together the path of a genuine and lasting reconciliation. God being all powerful and eternal, you might think God's people would have things go their way. However, this has not been the experience of God's prophets and saints. The readings today deal with this painful reality.

In the **First Reading**, the Spirit comes upon Ezekiel, commissioning him as prophet. There was nothing humanly glorious, but rather he experienced insults and persecution as he was called on to prophesise to a defiant and obstinate people.

St Paul recounts in the **Second Reading** how his ministry led to insult, hardships, persecution and agony. In every way, Paul says he feels weak. Yet Paul realised that God wanted him to know his weakness, because this allowed Paul in his humility to be filled with the power of Christ. So Paul carried on, powerfully witnessing to Christ, right up to his martyrdom in.

These readings set the scene for the **Gospel**. Despite his teaching, Jesus' own people did not accept him. They thought they knew him and could not accept that Jesus might be so much more than the carpenter's son. On his part, Jesus was amazed at their lack of faith and could work no miracles there. If people had no faith, He could do nothing for them.

The themes for ATSI Sunday – "Keep the fires burning" and "Strong in faith" are related and necessary for those working for Reconciliation. For it is to retain hope that God's ways, whatever happens, will in the end win out. And faith attaches us to God, so we can continue to know God's love deep within, giving us the capacity to love and forgive even in the darkest of times.

PARISH SACRAMENTAL JOURNEY: CICC

[Christian Initiation of Children of Catechetical Age]

Registrations are open for children aged 7 years or older who wish to receive the Sacraments in Round 2 2024. There are four steps:

Step 1: Contact the Parish Office on 3849 7158 or

sec.umg@bne.catholic.net.au and register your child who will receive a Mass card.

Step 2: Come along to Mass as often as possible to enable your child to learn the ropes, feel confident in the church, **participate in the liturgy** as he/she is ready and begins to feel at home.

Step 3: As Fr Pat gets to know you and your child he will **invite** you to take the next step. Please be aware we run two groups per year (Semester 1 and Semester 2).

Step 4: Children are **enrolled** in the Sacrament Program and will attend family centred activity sessions to **prepare** for the celebration of **Penance, Confirmation and First Communion**.

If children are not yet Baptised, please contact the parish office.

Fr Pat or Pauline are happy to talk to you about the process and assist you in any way.
