READINGS

Proverbs 9:1-6

Come and eat my bread; drink the wine I have prepared.

Ephesians 5:15-20

Be watchful that you may know the will of God.

GOSPEL

John: 6:51-58

My flesh is real food and my blood is real drink.

In the First Reading, the author uses the metaphor of a house to portray Lady Wisdom at work. Like any good schoolteacher our author wants to present going to school and the rigours of study in as attractive a light as possible. Her basic message is that if you 'drink the wine I have prepared', that is, if you imbibe the wisdom that follows in the subsequent chapters of the book of Proverbs, then you will have a fruitful and meaningful life. The contrast between wisdom and folly is designed to alert one to the way evil can masquerade as good and seduce us by what appears to be success. Follow Lady Wisdom's curriculum and you have the best chance of developing a true rather than a distorted perception of reality.



Today's Gospel is the whole purpose of this long discourse, for today's passage focuses on the Christian Eucharist. The change is signalled by the words 'flesh to eat'. Up until now, Jesus has spoken of eating *bread* in a metaphorical sense, but the word 'eat' that is now used is very physical, it is like 'munch' or 'chew'. The imagery Jesus uses 'to eat the flesh and drink the blood' would be particularly horrific to a Jewish audience for whom blood is forbidden, and animals are killed in a special way so that all the blood is drained out, since the blood is the life-force and belongs to God.

Today's passage needs to be understood as reflecting on the living presence of the risen Jesus now present with the community. Only in this resurrection perspective will the discourse have any sense and Eucharist have any meaning. 'Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood live in me and I live in them.' In other words, those who believe in me, live in me and I live in them. Our liturgical celebration of Eucharist engages our entire self, in all our senses of sight, touch, smell, hearing and taste. God has come to us incarnated in the flesh of Jesus, and through Eucharist this incarnate, bodily presence is still available to us, and we can make our bodily response in faith to him.

In the **Second Reading**, Christians are encouraged to live like the wise. The way of the wise is directed by the intoxicating Spirit of God. Prompted by the Spirit, in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, the Ephesians are told to thank God who is called Father. Living in this manner is the true way of wisdom.
