14 / 15 September 2024

### READINGS

**Isaiah 50:5-9** *I gave my body to those who struck me.*

**James 2:14-18** *Faith without good works is dead.*

### GOSPEL

**Mark 8:27-35** *You are the Christ ... the Son of Man was destined to suffer much.*

**Sept 1-Oct 4** is celebrated as the Season of Creation. This year's theme is "To hope and act with creation." If you'd like to know more about the Season of Creation have a look at <https://seasonofcreation.org/> or have a look at Pope Francis' encyclical *Laudato Si* (2015, <https://bit.ly/3Xc8syC>) and apostolic exhortation *Laudato Deum* (2023, <https://bit.ly/3X1K9na>). Our Parish Facebook page will offer prayer and other opportunities to celebrate this Season.



The **First Reading** comes from the third speech/oracle from a series of four passages in Isaiah collectively known as the Servant Songs. In this third passage, the servant challenges the adversaries to bring their grievances and hostility to court and debate them openly. The passage indicates the servant has suffered or is threatened by violence; but emboldened by his conviction of God's support he resolved not to repay violence with violence. In this court case before the nations, God is the advocate who will 'prove' the innocence and righteousness of the servant. The New Testament writers saw Jesus as the one who fulfilled the mission of the servant.

Today's **Gospel**, marks a turning point in the Mark's Gospel. Peter's proclamation is the first time anyone has correctly identified Jesus as Messiah but he is not aware yet of how Jesus will be a saviour. Peter, like Jews of this time, was likely expecting a political figure like King David who would free Israel from the Roman Empire.

This is not Jesus' vision.

Peter, with his political and very human image of who Jesus might be, opposes Jesus. He encourages Jesus to avoid trouble and "live to fight another day". And Jesus' response shows us that Jesus is wrestling with this option - Satan means Tempter. Peter's encouragement to avoid Jerusalem is tempting, it's the easier path. But Jesus keeps focus on God's calling and vision. For the remainder of the Gospel the disciples will wrestle with holding together two truths concerning Jesus: on the one hand, that he is indeed the long-awaited Messiah; on the other hand, that he will fulfil his messianic role by entering into the pain and suffering of this world, even to the point of death – something totally unforeseen in Jewish messianic expectation.



The **Second Reading** continues addressing the misunderstanding of the nature of true faith, insisting that genuine faith is not simply orthodox doctrine. Faith must be practical, expressed in action and authentic worship. While James' opponents want to separate faith and works, James insists faith that does not reveal itself in action is dead.
