### GOSPEL

**Mark 9:30-37**

*The Son of Man will be delivered into the hands of humanity ... All you wish to be first must make themselves the servants of all.*

**Sept 1–Oct 4** is celebrated as the Season of Creation. This year's theme is "To hope and act with creation." The **First Reading** describes reaction to "the righteous one", who is challenging the "godless" who have stopped following God and are breaking the law. The godless are portrayed formulating a case themselves, a test of 'the virtuous man'. Their words show that they have no relationship to God but instead usurp the position of God and make God part of their cruel experiment. The way they propose to treat the virtuous man is the very antithesis of the way that the author believes the God of Israel treats the chosen people and humanity in general. In usurping the position of God these characters reveal just how godless they are. Following the typical pattern of the Old Testament, the next chapter of this text contains a confident profession of faith in the provision of God, even after death... "the souls of the righteous are in the hands of God...their hope is full of immortality."

The **Gospel** contains Jesus' second teaching about his death. The disciples still don't understand what he is saying and they are "afraid to ask". Not afraid of Jesus, but afraid to really hear what Jesus is saying. Instead they argue about who is the greatest. Jesus decides to dramatise his instruction. He puts a child in front of them and identifies himself with the child. In the ancient world children had no social status or value whatsoever; until adulthood they were nobodies. For someone outside the family to 'welcome' a child would be to turn prevailing values and social norms upside down; it would require putting aside all one's ideas of self-importance and adult status, and simply meeting the child as an equal, as 'child' to child.



The **Second Reading** approaches the same issues of power and ambition in the uncompromising language typical of this letter. The community has failed to travel along the path of wisdom. James wants to know the cause of these conflicts, not so that he can reprimand them, but that he might instruct them. The Christians have no one to blame but themselves for the lack of harmony in their personal and communal lives. As Christians, in prayer we call upon Jesus to be our friend and guide, leading us on the way to truth and life.
