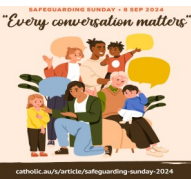

Sept 1–Oct 4 is celebrated as the Season of Creation. This year's theme is "To hope and act with creation." Our Parish Facebook page will offer prayer and other opportunities to celebrate this Season.



Today, the Catholic Church in Australia also marks Safeguarding Sunday at the conclusion of National Child Protection week. It seeks to acknowledge the immense damage caused by the sexual abuse of children and adults at risks by priests, religious and lay people within Catholic contexts and it reiterates the commitment to practices and protocols that create and maintain safe environments for all peoples that have been put in place by the Church. We are invited to pray for those harmed by abuse, directly and indirectly.

The **First Reading**, proclaims a hope filled image of God's intervention on behalf of faithful Israel exiled in Babylon. In this passage, the vengeance and retribution spoken of is against Israel's enemies and is therefore part of Israel's liberation, not punishment.

This passage is explicitly referenced in today's **Gospel**, where Mark has the people paraphrase the words of Isaiah. In publicly speaking about the miracle and linking it with this text, the crowd are pointing to Jesus as this long-awaited saviour. No wonder Jesus asks for secrecy.

This is, of course, the episode when the *Ephphetha* ritual is included in the liturgy of Christian Baptism. The celebrant touches the ears and mouth of the person being baptised and prays, 'May (the Lord Jesus) soon touch your ears to receive his word, and your mouth to proclaim his faith, to the praise and glory of God the Father.' In a symbolic sense, then, the man represents all believers. Apart from the grace of God we are 'deaf' to the Word spoken to us. In the sacrament Jesus gives us the capacity to hear the life-giving Word. Having heard that Word in the context of our own lives, we then can turn to praise God and share what we have found with others. Our ears are opened and our tongues are 'loosened' for full participation in the community of faith.

In the **Second Reading**, James condemns class distinctions within the Christian community, echoing the prophetic tradition and also Jesus' Beatitudes sermon. While generally Australia sees itself as fairly egalitarian, there are groups within our community that are stigmatised for circumstances out of their control. How do we respond to our own biases?
