READINGS

Deuteronomy 6:2-6 *Hear Israel, you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart.*

Hebrews 7:23-28 *This one, because he remains for ever, has an eternal priesthood.*

GOSPEL

Mark 12:28-34 *This is the first commandment, and the second is similar to it.*

In the Catholic tradition, as part of living out our faith, November is dedicated to prayer for those who have died. Our traditions remind us that in times of great sadness we are never alone.

In Parish churches from this weekend you will notice the 'Tree of Life'. Please come and write your deceased loved ones' names on the paper leaves and place them on the tree. Together we watch the tree come to life as we remember our community includes those who have 'gone in faith before us'.



The text for today's **First Reading** became the 'Shema', the prayer that every devout Jew recites each morning on rising. The opening word 'Shema' means 'listen'; it also has the sense of 'obey'. The prayer is a daily reminder not only of the covenant obligations but also of the privilege from which those obligations flow. Israel is a people addressed by God, called each day to listen and obey.

This is the wider context of the supreme commandment to love the Lord alone 'with all your heart, and with all your soul and all your might'. 'Love' has the sense of cleaving to God, to the exclusion of all other objects of worship. 'Heart', 'soul' and 'strength' refer not so much to separate capacities but together communicate a loving commitment that engages the totality of a person.

In today's **Gospel**, the question raised – which commandment of the Torah is the 'first'? – was a standard item of discussion amongst the rabbis. The Scribe is, then, seeking the opinion of this controversial teacher on the matter.

Jesus answers with the 'first' being the commandment every practicing Jew prayed twice daily. God is to be our first and primary focus.

Jesus could have left the answer there but he doesn't. He adds the 'second' - love your neighbour as yourself—and thereby links the two together. Our relationship with God must inform and transform our relationship with others. This is then reaffirmed by the Scribe who comments that these are 'much more important than burnt offerings or sacrifices', reminding the hearers of the gospel that their faith is relational, not simply a matter of doing the right things enough times.

In the **Second Reading**, continues the sense of Jesus as High Priest. Three aspects of the extraordinary high priesthood of Jesus are celebrated in the second reading: its permanence, the holiness of Jesus the high priest, and the legitimacy of the high priesthood.
