OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

23 / 24 November 2024

READINGS

Daniel 7:13-14

His sovereignty is eternal.

Revelation 1:5-8

*The ruler of the kings of the earth...made us a line
of kings, priests to serve his God.*

GOSPEL

John 18:33-37

You say that I am a king.

Whatever term might have more contemporary appeal that "king", there's a more fundamental issue to grapple with today. The choice of a more agreeable title for Christ the King can't disguise the fact that Christ does not appear to be in charge of the world at all.

Yet by naming Christ as King, we want to claim that it's his defining qualities (his unconditional love, mercy, freedom of heart, peace, selflessness, truth, faith...) that have the last say. Today's festival invites us to cast off the blinkers that lock our attention onto the dark powers rampant in the world. Today we pray to see Christ at play everywhere in the world, even in (and perhaps especially in) its grimmest places.

Today's **First Reading** tells us the last part of a vision/dream (it is worthwhile reading the whole chapter). Before our reading starts, the author tells of a dream where they see four great beasts emerge. Then the "one of great age" or "Ancient One" sits on the throne and strips the beasts of their power. God is in control.

Finally, we have today's passage. "One like a son of man" comes before the "Ancient One" and is given all authority, glory and power. This passage is traditionally applied to Christ, but the text itself contains interpretation in the paragraphs that follow today's reading. In this interpretation the "one like a son of man" is a representation of the saints of the Most High, therefore of believers/the people of Israel. Either way, the passage contains the hope that the powers that seem to overwhelm God's people will not last. Ultimately God will strip away all other powers and authorities.

In the **Second Reading** we move to the New Testament apocalyptic text—the book of the Apocalypse or Revelation. This letter draws on the biblical apocalyptic tradition to speak to the early Church, oppressed by the power of the Roman empire. Through imagery and allusions from the Old Testament it assures the Church of the triumph of Christ, who is the beginning and the end of all human history.

Finally, in the **Gospel**, Pilate asks the question of Jesus "are you a king"? But Pilate is thinking in a similar way to the way we've seen the apostles thinking. They all expect a military, warrior king like King David. Jesus, however, sees his kingship differently. Through the Gospels we see Jesus representing authority and leadership as truly being service of others, of not focusing on self but on the needs of the world, of dying to self for the good of others. Pilate and the Jewish leaders only hear the challenge to both political power and religious messianic expectations.

[Christian [Initiation of Children of Catechetical Age]

Registrations are open for children aged 7 years or older who wish to receive the Sacraments in Round 1 2025. There are four steps:

Step 1: Contact the Parish Office on **3849 7158** or

sec.umg@bne.catholic.net.au and **register** your child who will receive a Mass card.

Step 2: Come along to Mass as often as possible to enable your child to feel confident in the church, **participate in the liturgy** and begins to feel at home.

Step 3: As the Priests get to know you and your child you will be **invited** to take the next step. Please note we run usually two groups per year.

Step 4: Children are **enrolled** in the Sacrament Program and will attend family centred activity sessions to **prepare** for the celebration of **Penance, Confirmation and First Communion.**
