LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE



Priest: Lord, our God,
we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ;
He is Prince of Peace, the hope of the
peoples.

All: **Prepare the way of the Lord.
We light this candle in peace,
the peace of our coming
saviour, Jesus.
Let us prepare then,
the way of the Lord.**

JESSE TREE SYMBOLS

During Advent we will add two symbols each week to the Jesse Tree, reminding us of the faithfulness of God and of the men and women God used to prepare the world for the coming of Jesus.



The **Jar** reminds us of God's miracles. God regularly uses ordinary objects to show us extraordinary things. Gideon brings broth in a jar to the Angel of the Lord, only to see the Angel turn the offering into fire (Judges 6-8) and Elijah tells the widow the jar won't empty until after the end of the drought and it doesn't (1 Kings 17).

Joseph's coat reminds us of how God uses Joseph to rescue the Israelites from famine and shows God's faithfulness to the covenant made with Abraham and renewed with Jacob/Israel (Genesis 37-48).



The second and third weeks of Advent this year focus particularly on the role of John the Baptist as the one who prepared the way for Jesus and announced his coming. It continues the theme of preparation that began last week, but still, rather than preparing for the birth of Jesus, we are exploring the wider theme of preparation. This gospel emphasises that John was preaching 'a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins'. Throughout the gospel of Luke, the recognition of sinfulness and the desire to repent and seek forgiveness is the prelude to receiving God's favour.

It makes it clear that one way in which we can prepare a way for the Lord is to recognise our faults and failings and to seek forgiveness. It is only through such repentance that we can make ourselves receptive to the love of God. We are absolutely assured of God's love. The problem is that we often feel that we are undeserving of that love or are unable to receive it.

When we are called to 'Prepare a way for the Lord' it is a call to prepare a way in our own hearts – to break down the barriers that we have put up; to clear the obstacles we place between us and God. God's love will find a way! We simply make the way easier for ourselves to recognise

PARISH SACRAMENTAL JOURNEY: CICCA

[Christian Initiation of Children of Catechetical Age]

Registrations are open for children aged 7 years or older who wish to receive the Sacraments in Round 1 2025. There are four steps:

- Step 1:** Contact the Parish Office on **3849 7158** or **sec.umg@bne.catholic.net.au** and **register** your child who will receive a Mass card.
- Step 2:** Come along to Mass as often as possible to enable your child to feel confident in the church, **participate in the liturgy** and begins to feel at home.
- Step 3:** As the Priests get to know you and your child you will be **invited** to take the next step. Please note we run usually two groups per year.
- Step 4:** Children are **enrolled** in the Sacrament Program and will attend family centred activity sessions to **prepare** for the celebration of **Penance, Confirmation and First Communion.**
