READINGS

Nehemiah 8:2-6, 8-10 *They read from the book of Law and they understood what was read.*

1 Corinthians 12:12-30 *Together you are Christ's body; but each of you is a different part of it.*

GOSPEL

Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21 *The scriptures were fulfilled on this day.*



The Scripture readings for today focus our attention on the importance and liberating power of the Word of God as "sacramental", making God present in our midst. The readings challenge us to listen to the Word, accept it into our hearts, then put it into practice as we live out our lives, thus liberating ourselves and others from all types of bondages.

Today, we begin reading from the Gospel written by Saint Luke, the companion of Saint Paul. Saint Luke the evangelist was a doctor, and he endeavoured to make his Gospel an abundant and sure source for all who believe in Christ and who love God. Luke is the only

Gospel that begins with a prologue. It sets forth the motivation for composing the story of Jesus. Luke accepts that he is not the first one to write but he wants to be accurate, based on the earliest of traditions, and clearly organized. He writes to Theophilus who may have been a recent convert or a benefactor of the author. He wishes to give him that certain account of Jesus to the certainty of the teaching already received and convince him of his faith. Theophilus means lover of God, or the beloved of God and it means each one of us. Luke clearly acknowledges that he himself never saw Jesus. His gospel was written at least 50 years after Jesus' death and resurrection.

Today's Gospel, presenting Jesus' "inaugural address" in the synagogue of Nazareth in which he outlines a theology of total liberation, marks a great moment in Jesus' ministry.

Jesus claims that he is One sent "to bring glad tidings to the poor, liberation to captives, recovery of sight to the blind and freedom for the oppressed" - language that reflects the Biblical year of Jubilee. To the great amazement and disbelief of his own townsmen, Jesus declares that Isaiah's prophecy is being fulfilled at that very moment "in your hearing", because the prophecy foretells and describes Jesus' own mission and ministry. Jesus' mission is still to give liberation to everyone who will listen to his "Good News", accept it and put it into practice.

This is also the mission of the Church and of every person baptised in the Church. Being a Christian is the same thing as being a missionary. Proclaiming the Gospel with one's word and even before, with one's life, is the primary aim of the Christian community and of each of its members.

[Christian Initiation of Children of Catechetical Age]

Registrations are open for children aged 7 years or older who wish to receive the Sacraments in Round 1 2025. There are four steps:

- Step 1:** Contact the Parish Office on **3849 7158** or email **sec.umg@bne.catholic.net.au** and **register** your child who will receive a Mass card.
- Step 2:** Come along to Mass as often as possible to enable your child to feel confident in the church, **participate in the liturgy** and to feel at home.
- Step 3:** As the Priests get to know you and your child you will be **invited** to take the next step. Please note we usually run two groups per year.
- Step 4:** Children are **enrolled** in the Sacrament Program and will attend family centred activity sessions to **prepare** for the celebration of **Penance, Confirmation and First Communion**.
