Friends this Sunday, Jesus describes the nature of discipleship in a Christian, namely, that it is manifested in very tangible ways. Those who follow Christ are able to produce good fruit in themselves. They can "see", they do not lead double lives, they add value to the world around them.

The capacity to "see" the world wisely, to "lead the blind" and to add value to the world around us are the fruit of becoming intentional disciples – willing students - of Jesus Christ. At a deeper level, it is an active effort to *get to know* the God whom we worship, understand how this God wishes to relate to us, and how this God's vision for how we relate to and celebrate each other and our common home. Deepening our faith, outside mass, is like wanting to know our best friends or our beloved outside of necessary times. Those are the moments we get to experience surprise and awe at their quirks, gifts, contradictions, their surprising capacities for things we wrote them off on, and so on.

Conversely, relationships can at times die out or worse, become lukewarm, so that they are not urgent enough to address, but not lifegiving either – they can become... duty.

Our relationship with God is always at risk of becoming duty. Some of us may not have had opportunities to deepen our faith since we were children. Others may have been too busy or simply not have had access to resources. If you would like to keep deepening your faith – your knowledge of the God whom you worship and who loves you – and of the family he has drawn you into, join as many of the programs listed below. I do ask that if you wish to join, registration will be essential. I will be printing or purchasing resources accordingly. They are usually about \$22.

Upcoming Programs:

LENT - Weekly 30 mins series on styles of prayer in the Catholic Tradition. Free.

HOLY WEEK – Two Day Screening of Bach's St. Matthew's Passion (total 195 mins). Attendance capped at 24 attendees.

Easter Season – Group reading and discussion on book on prayer – 5-6 weeks.

Ordinary Time – Fortnightly/ Monthly Catechesis or another group reading with discussion.

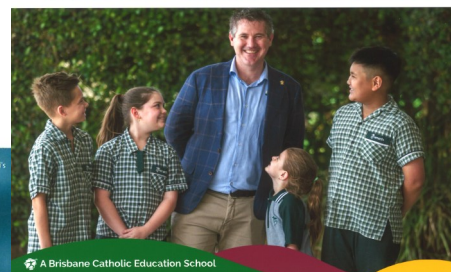
