The Egyptian pyramids are world-famous as one of the "seven Wonders" of the ancient world. But they are gigantic tombs containing the mummified bodies of Egyptian Pharaohs. Westminster Abbey is famous, and thousands visit it, because the dead bodies of famous writers, philosophers, and politicians are entombed there. But there is a Shrine of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem, and pilgrims from all over the world visit a tomb there which is empty with a note at its entrance which says, "He *is not here*." It is famous because Jesus Christ, who was once buried there, rose from the dead, leaving an empty tomb, as he had told his disciples he would. He is Risen, alleluia. Happy Easter to all!

Today we gather in joy, in wonder, in hope — because the **tomb is empty**. It's such a simple image: a stone rolled away, a place where the body of Jesus once lay, now empty. And yet, in that emptiness, God speaks the most powerful truth of all: **He is not here — He is risen**.

The empty tomb means that the story didn't end on the cross. It didn't end in suffering or defeat. It ended — or rather, it **began again** — with resurrection, with victory, with the promise that **death no longer has the final word**.

This is not just something that happened long ago. It's a truth that still changes our lives today. Are there places in your life that feel like tombs — places of grief, regret, failure, or fear? Do you sometimes feel like the stone is too heavy, the night too long, the hope too far gone?

Easter tells us: **God is not done**. What looks like the end is not the end. What feels like loss can become new life. What was buried can rise again. Let us be the people of Hope.
