READINGS

Acts 14:21-27 *They assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them.*

Revelation 21:1-5 *He will wipe away all the tears from their eyes.*

GOSPEL

John 13:31-35 *I give you a new commandment: love one another.*

"By this love you have for one another, everyone will know that you are my disciples", so says Jesus in this Sunday's gospel.

The fraternity that the early Christians shared was indeed noted by secular contemporaries. It was radical enough that they even sold their possessions and shared from a common fund, something I would only expect to see in a marriage.

That closeness or unity between the first disciples, or at least some atom of it, seemed to be in the background of the new Pope's opening words on the balcony when he was announced: "Peace be with you!" He had in mind then, and has in subsequent speeches named his concern regarding "piecemeal third world wars" happening around the world. I wonder if some of the simmering wars in the Church were also in his mind. It remains to be seen whether building fraternity in an age of tension becomes a hallmark of his pontificate.

Another recurring theme emerging is his concerns around the safe use and deployment of AI. The previous Pope Leo had written about the rights and obligations of workers; he has expressed an interest in the same topics with respect to AI.

His namesake also was a bridge builder between Church and State; he did not presume there to be an innate hostility. Such an effort will only continue to be necessary to guide how the Church speaks from between the crossfire of culture wars.

Pontiff – means "bridge builder". It draws on the image of a priest who facilitates a drawing closer between the people and God. This is a ministry which begins for each Christian in baptism. Yet, as it takes on new depths in Pope Leo's life, he will by necessity have to also build bridges between various quarters of the Church, between denominations, and between Church and State. Let us pray then, that he may be guided by the Holy Spirit at all times and enjoy every success.
