Teasing apart the opening prayer:

Friends, on occasion, while praying the mass, I am struck by the density of what the prayers contain. The texts of the mass are highly regulated, even, in recent times, to the placing of punctuation marks. This regulating ensures that what we pray aligns with our belief and keeps out anything that borders on our own private impressions, fears, assumptions etc about God. In the bid to deepen our appreciation for them, I share below this Sunday's opening prayer with a short reflection. The opening prayer is called the "Collect" evoking the image that after the priest has informed the people to pray for their intentions, he collects and offers them up in the one opening prayer to God:

Let us pray.

Grant, almighty God,

that we may celebrate with heartfelt devotion these days of joy,

which we keep in honour of the risen Lord,

and that what we relive in remembrance

we may always hold to in what we do.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ...Amen.

In essence, the prayer is asking God to give us the help to celebrate this season diligently and with emotion, **so that** by celebrating well, we will always keep the resurrection at the forefront of our minds. While whole chapters could be written on this prayer, I share only two thoughts below:

"Grant....that we may celebrate" with zeal and emotion: It is easy to relegate emotion and zeal to moments or things which trigger our feelings: something delightful or, say, the promise of a prize. This prayer turns to God for that emotion and zeal. It receives it as a gift, so as to make the best gift possible back to God. All is gift. Our lives, our bodies, voices, minds, our belongings, Jesus Christ, our faith, the sacraments. A weekday "preface" prayer at mass reads: "although you have no need of our praise, yet our thanksgiving is itself your gift". When we worship well we benefit here on earth as well as receive salvation. So we ask God to help us do it well.

Keeping the resurrection at the forefront of mind: The Resurrection is the reason the church exists at all. If Jesus had not risen, there would have been no message or "good news" to share. Jesus' victory of sin and death is why the Church bothers doing anything. The Church exists to tell the world: "Whatever the season, Jesus is the light at the end of the tunnel – heaven has been opened to you". Any charity the Church does, is its way of saying "You are worth looking after, because you were worth Jesus coming among us and dying for".

How does your faith in Jesus' resurrection and your own hope of salvation colour how you pray, worship at mass, handle joys, disappointments, people...everything?
