### READINGS

**Deuteronomy 30:10-14** *Let the instruction of the Lord God be near you.*

**Colossians 1:15-20** *All things were created through him and for him.*

### GOSPEL

**Luke 10:25-37** *Who is my neighbour?*

We live in a world drifting away from God, where many forget their true purpose. Yet, Scripture reminds us of God's constant love and care—He created everything for our good and watches over us like a shepherd. Today's Gospel calls us to be His instruments, helping others even if they're different from us. Through the parable of the Good Samaritan, Jesus shows that God's grace can come through anyone, even those we least expect.

This parable is one of the most powerful teachings of Jesus. This story turns social expectations upside down. In Jesus' time, Samaritans were hated by the Jews, yet it is the Samaritan who acts with true mercy and compassion. The message is clear: love knows no boundaries of race, religion, or social status. Jesus concludes the parable by telling us to "go and do likewise."

The Good Samaritan challenges us today more than ever. In a world divided by politics, prejudice, individualism and indifference, this parable calls us to see beyond the labels we place on others. It urges us to be people of action, not just sentiment—to step into the pain and needs of others with compassion and generosity. The Samaritan didn't let prejudice or imagined consequences stop him. He saw a wounded man and chose compassion over caution, mercy over mistrust. He embraced the connection—even when it was inconvenient and costly.

Being a Good Samaritan doesn't always require dramatic actions. It might mean noticing a struggling neighbour, offering a kind word, or helping someone in need without expecting anything in return. What matters is our willingness to interrupt our routines for the sake of love.

May we strive daily to live as the Good Samaritan did—moved not by duty, but by compassion. And in doing so, we reflect the heart of Christ to a hurting world. Let's not miss opportunities to be kind—because sometimes, a small act of openness can lead to healing, hope, and unexpected grace.
