READINGS

Sirach 3:17-20, 28-29

Humble yourself and you will find favour with the Lord.

Hebrews 12:18-19, 22-24

You have to come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God.

GOSPEL

Luke 14:1, 7-14

All who exalt themselves shall be humbled and all who humble themselves shall be exalted.

As human beings, we often seek power and control. We want to be first, to stay ahead, and to lead others. But when pride takes over, humility is pushed aside, and we lose sight of what truly matters. Humility is a wise and holy virtue, central to Christian life. Jesus Himself invites us to learn from Him, for He is meek and humble of heart.

In today's Gospel, Jesus shares a meal with religious leaders and uses the moment to teach about discipleship, especially the virtue of humility. He reminds us that humility is the foundation of all other Christian virtues. It helps us see our own lowliness before God and opens our hearts to those who are poor, forgotten, or pushed aside.

This message speaks powerfully to us on **Social Justice Sunday**. We are called not only to be humble before God, but also to stand with those who are marginalized. Jesus challenges us to welcome the excluded, to lift up the downtrodden, and to serve others rather than ourselves. The rich and powerful often struggle with humility because they rely on their own strength. But true discipleship means trusting in God and choosing love over status.

In the first reading, a wise teacher tells his students that humility brings favour in God's eyes. It is not weakness—it is strength that serves. On this Social Justice Sunday, we are reminded that justice begins with humility: seeing others with compassion, listening with respect, and acting with courage to build a more inclusive and loving community.

Since 1940, the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference has released a statement for reflection and discussion ahead of Social Justice Sunday, addressing key issues in Australian society." This year's statement is *Signs of Hope on the Edge: Serving People Living in Homelessness and Mental Ill-Health*.

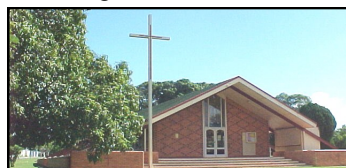
