READINGS: Malachi 3:19-20 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

GOSPEL: Luke 21:5-19

Dear friends in Christ,

We are on the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, the second-to-last Sunday of the liturgical year C, just before the Feast of Christ the King. Its readings focus on the "last things" - judgment, perseverance, and hope in God's promise.

Prophet Malachi tells us that this Day will bring healing and reward for the faithful, but punishment for those who turn away from God. St. Paul encourages the Thessalonians not to sit idle while waiting for the Lord, but to keep working faithfully and living responsibly. The Gospel of Luke reminds us that no one knows the time of the end. Signs will come, and believers may face trials, but Jesus promises that those who persevere in faith will be saved.

Luke's community faced persecution, yet Jesus' words gave them courage: *"Don't give up - God is always with you!"* This same promise is ours today. We are called to trust in God's protection, remain faithful, and rely on His strength, not our own.

The Good News is clear: Christ's return is not something to fear, but to celebrate. Let us continue to live each day with hope, perseverance, and joyful expectation of the Lord's coming.
