Dear friends,

Today's Gospel from Matthew invites us to contemplate the quiet strength and obedient heart of St Joseph. In St Joseph, we witness a man who listens deeply, trusts completely, and responds generously to God's call. His obedience is not passive; it is loving, courageous, and responsive, shaped by a heart attuned to God's voice.

Matthew tells us that Joseph faced a moment of deep confusion. Mary, his betrothed, was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Joseph could not fully understand this mystery, yet he chose the path of compassion, seeking to protect Mary from shame. It is in this moment of uncertainty that God speaks to him through an angel: *"Do not be afraid."* These words change everything. Joseph rises from fear into faith, from hesitation into obedient action.

His response is immediate. He takes Mary into his home, embraces the mystery of the Virgin Birth, and accepts his role in God's saving plan. Joseph becomes the earthly guardian of Jesus, not through power or prestige, but through humble obedience. His "yes" allows God's promise to unfold.

St Joseph teaches us that obedience is not blind submission; it is trusting God even when the path is unclear. It is listening with the heart, surrendering our fears, and allowing God to lead us beyond our own understanding. Like Joseph, we are invited to welcome Christ into our lives, our families, and our decisions.

As we reflect on this Gospel, may we learn from Joseph's quiet strength. May we cultivate a heart that listens, a faith that trusts, and a willingness to say "yes" to God's surprising invitations.

I warmly welcome each of you and your families to our Christmas celebration. As we stand just days away from Christmas, I am reminded how much I miss celebrating with my own family. Yet coming together as a parish family is a moment of grace and a beautiful sign of God's love among us. Please check the newsletter for our Christmas Mass times.

JESSE TREE SYMBOLS

During Advent we add two symbols each week to the Jesse Tree, reminding us of the faithfulness of God and of the men and women God used to prepare the world for the coming of Jesus.



Jonah's **Big Fish** reminds us of the lengths to which God will go. Moses' burning bush, Balaam's donkey (Numbers 22), angels, dreams - when God has a message, God finds a way even when we think we can outrun or hide from it.

The **Flower** reminds us of the promise that the root of Jesse would see new life, new branches bearing fruit (Isaiah 11:1). Ultimately, this shoot would be fulfilled in Jesus. Flowers are also often used as reminders that even in harsh or difficult places, like deserts, God is still at work.

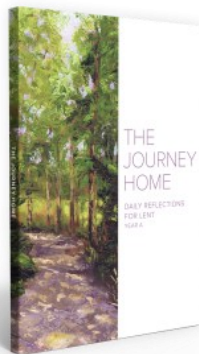
