READINGS: Isaiah 49:3, 5-6 1 Corinthians 1:1-3

GOSPEL: John 1:29-34

Dear friends,

In today's Gospel, John the Baptist offers us a powerful example of humility and clarity of vocation. When he sees Jesus approaching, he does not draw attention to himself. Instead, he proclaims, *"Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world."* John knows exactly who he is - and who he is not. He understands that his mission is to point others to Christ, not to seek honour for himself.

John's humility is not weakness; it is freedom of heart. He is free from ego, free from comparison, free from the need to be the centre. Because of this freedom, he can recognise God's work unfolding before him. He can say with confidence, *"I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me told me..."* John listens deeply, discerns carefully, and obeys faithfully.

This Gospel invites us to reflect on our own baptismal responsibility. Like John, we are called to witness Christ in our daily lives - not by dramatic gestures, but through quiet faithfulness, kindness, and integrity. Humility allows us to see God's will more clearly. When our hearts are uncluttered by pride or fear, we become more attentive to the gentle movements of the Spirit.

We live in a world that often celebrates self-promotion, but John reminds us that true greatness lies in serving God's purpose. Our task is not to shine for ourselves, but to reflect the light of Christ so that others may find hope.

As we continue our journey of faith, may we grow in humility, seek God's will with sincerity, and courageously bear witness to the Lamb of God who walks with us each day.
