## FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

7 / 8 February 2026

**READINGS:** Isaiah 58:7-10 1 Corinthians 2:1-5

**GOSPEL:** Matthew 5:13-16

In the Gospel, Jesus uses two simple yet powerful images to describe the vocation of his disciples: *salt* and *light*. With these metaphors, Jesus tells us who we are called to be in the world — not withdrawn from it, but deeply present within it.

Salt was precious in the ancient world. It preserved food, purified, healed, and gave flavour. To be the *salt of the earth* means that Christians are called to preserve what is good, to resist moral and spiritual corruption, and to bring the flavour of faith, hope, and joy into a world that is often weary and discouraged. Through Baptism, our lives have been “seasoned” with Christ’s new life. When we live our faith with integrity, compassion, and quiet courage, we help make the world more humane, more just, and more bearable for others.

Jesus also calls us the *light of the world*. Light is not meant to be hidden. It reveals, guides, warns, and heals. Christ himself is the true Light, and we are called to reflect his light through our words and actions. Our everyday lives — how we speak, how we treat others, how we conduct ourselves at work, at home, and in public — become places where God’s light can shine. When our faith is lived authentically, it points others toward God and gives them courage to walk in hope.

Jesus’ challenge is clear: if salt loses its flavour, or if light is hidden, it fails its purpose. We are not called to blend in quietly or to be comfortable Christians, but to be faithful ones. May we renew our commitment to live as salt that preserves and light that shines, so that through our lives, others may come to know and praise God.

While walking along the beach, an older man noticed a young boy picking up starfish and throwing them back into the ocean. Curious, he asked, “Mate, what are you doing?” The boy replied, “I’m saving the starfish.” The man shook his head and said, “But the beach goes on for miles, and there are thousands of them. You can’t possibly make a difference.” The boy picked up another starfish, tossed it gently into the water, and said, “Well... it made a difference to that one.”

This simple story reminds us that none of us can fix everything, but each of us can do something. A small act of kindness, a quiet word of encouragement, a moment of patience — these are the ways we let the light of Christ shine in our homes, our parish, and our community. We may feel small, but in God’s hands, even the smallest act can make a real difference.

**Congratulations to Fr Prince on his appointment by the Archbishop as Associate Pastor of Jubilee Parish.** Fr Prince will take charge on 14 February. It’s a wonderful community made up of six churches, three primary schools, and several other ministries — a great place to begin your mission in Australia. We wish you every blessing as you start this new chapter of your priestly ministry. May God guide and strengthen you in all you do.
