SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

14 / 15 February 2026

READINGS: Sirach 15:15-20 1 Corinthians 2:6-10

GOSPEL: Matthew 5:17-37

The Greek philosopher Plato once described the human heart as a chariot pulled by two horses: Passion and Reason. Passion is strong, energetic, and full of desire, but it is wild and hard to control. Reason is calm, disciplined, and careful, but it can become too cautious and afraid to move forward. If the chariot is pulled only by Passion, it will rush ahead and soon crash. If it is pulled only by Reason, it may never go anywhere meaningful. But when Passion and Reason work together, the journey of life becomes purposeful and joyful.

Today's readings speak directly to this wisdom. God's law is not meant to crush our freedom or suppress our passion. Instead, it guides and shapes our desires so that they lead to life, love, and holiness. The laws God gives are like wheels in the hands of a skilled charioteer — helping us to direct our energy toward what truly matters.

In today's Gospel, Jesus appears as the new law-giver. He does not reject the law of Moses, but he deepens it. He moves the focus from outward actions to the inner life — from what we do to what we desire, intend, and choose in our hearts. Jesus teaches that true obedience is not forced or fearful; it is a free and loving response to God.

Jesus invites us to choose wisely — to let reason guide our passions, and to let God's law shape our freedom. When our hearts are formed by God's wisdom, our strength does not lead to chaos, and our discipline does not lead to fear. Instead, we grow into people of spiritual depth, commitment, and joy. God's law, lived in love, leads us not away from freedom, but into the fullness of life.

LENT 2026: We stand at the doorway of another Lent. Ash Wednesday leads us into this sacred season of prayer, fasting, and charity. When ashes are placed on our foreheads, we are reminded of our human weakness and our need for God's mercy. The words, "Repent and believe in the Gospel," invite us to turn back to God with sincere and humble hearts.

This simple sign teaches us three important truths. First, it reminds us who we are. God created us from the earth and gave us life. We are human, fragile, and mortal, and one day we will return to the earth. Life is short, and we are deeply connected to one another and to all of God's creation. Second, the ashes warn us that sin harms our relationship with God and with others. Repentance means more than feeling sorry; it means choosing what is good and living our faith.

Third, the ashes are a loving invitation. God knows our weakness and still welcomes us back with mercy and forgiveness.

Lent is not only about giving things up. It is about growing closer to God, renewing our hearts, and walking more faithfully with Christ. **Fr Rony**
